Dear Parents and Guardians,

As we approach the end of October, our students are gearing up for the end-of-year examinations upon their return from the mid-term break. This period is crucial for academic success, and your support can make a significant difference. Below are some practical strategies to help your child prepare effectively and manage the stresses associated with exams.

Supporting Your Child Through Exam Preparation

1. Establish a Consistent Routine

Create a daily study schedule that includes regular breaks and a consistent bedtime. A structured routine helps students manage their time effectively and reduces anxiety.

2. Provide a Comfortable Study Environment

Ensure your child has a quiet, well-lit space free from distractions. This environment fosters concentration and productivity.

3. Encourage Active Learning Techniques

Promote methods such as summarizing information, teaching the material to someone else, and practicing with past exam papers. These techniques enhance understanding and retention.

4. Discuss Goals and Motivation

Talk with your child about their aspirations and how their studies align with these goals. Understanding the purpose behind their efforts can boost motivation.

5. Monitor Well-being

Ensure your child maintains a balanced diet, gets adequate sleep, and engages in physical activity. A healthy body supports a healthy mind.

6. Be Available for Emotional Support

Create an open space for your child to express their concerns. Listening without judgement and offering reassurance can alleviate exam-related stress.

Celebrating Achievements in October

This month, we successfully completed the Primary and Lower Secondary Checkpoint Examinations. We await the results and are proud of our students' efforts.

Our Form 4 students are currently undertaking their IGCSE examinations, which will conclude on Wednesday, 12 November. We wish them the best in their remaining papers.

In extracurricular activities, we began the month with a highly successful U11 Co-ed Softball Festival, hosted by Kopano. Seven schools participated, and it was heartening to witness the true spirit of sportsmanship - children playing with enthusiasm and enjoyment, free from the pressure of competition.

The Softball season concluded with fixtures against Kgaswe, Mophato, and Clifton, culminating in the U13 Selection Tournament. We are proud to announce that Judah Seisa has been selected for the U13 Boys Northern Team, set to compete against their Southern counterparts on 15 November.

In chess, Mr. Makgethe accompanied five of our players to Livingstone House for the annual Chess Selection Tournament. Our students performed admirably, with Andile Moathodi selected to represent the Northern Team in a match against the South on 13 November in Orapa.



Our students also had some memorable educational outings this month:

- **Grade 1:** Our youngest learners visited Makhandlela Farm, where they explored farm life and interacted with a variety of animals including chickens, ducks, pigs, goats, rabbits, and guineafowls. The children learned about animal care, life cycles, and the interconnectedness of life on a farm - experiences that brought their classroom lessons vividly to life.
- **Grade 5:** The students enjoyed an unforgettable day at JP Roo's Farm in the Tuli Block, experiencing a full farm-to-table journey. They learned about soil preparation, planting, harvesting, and the machinery involved in vegetable farming. After a delicious lunch at Kwa Nokeng Lodge, the day concluded with a spectacular river cruise along the Limpopo River, where students observed wildlife and learned fascinating facts about the river ecosystem.
- **Grade 6:** This week, our students visited the Khama Rhino Sanctuary, gaining valuable insights into wildlife conservation and the importance of protecting endangered species.

Other grades will embark on their outings after the assessment week.

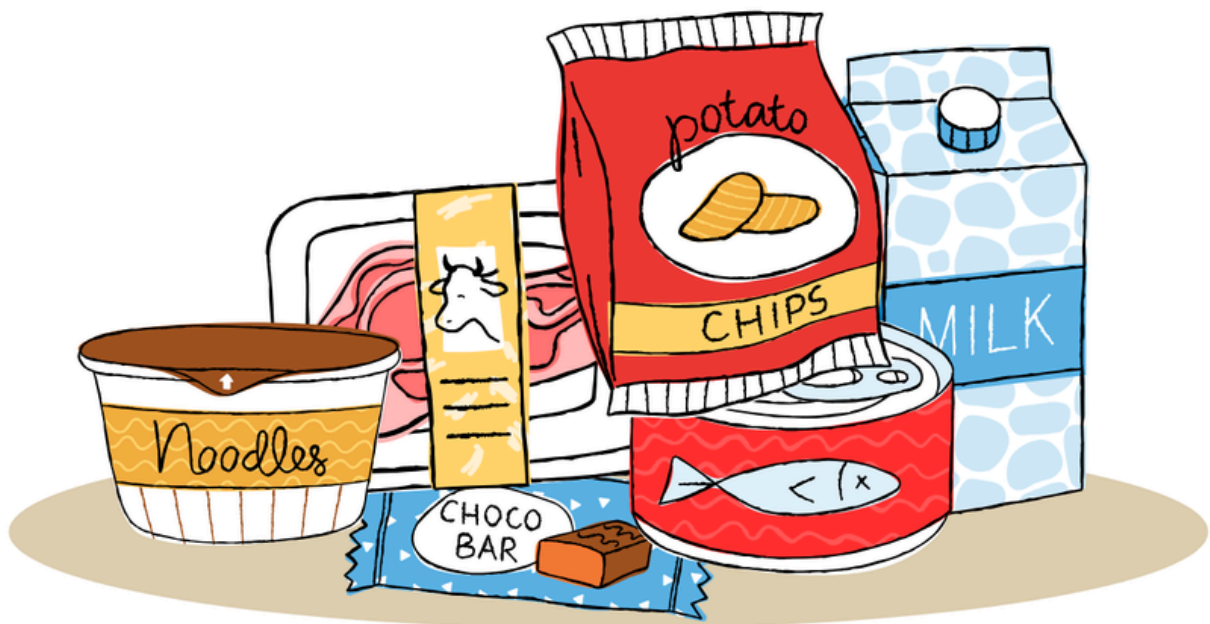

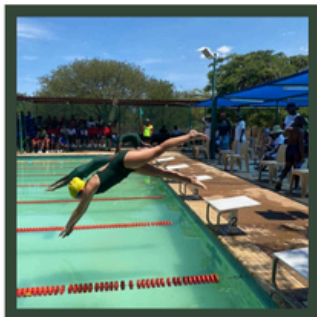
